I'd been meaning to write this up for a while, and now Nat Pryce has written up the 140 character version.



Meanwhile, the percent of commits with duplicated blocks grew even faster.

2024 was the first year that "Copy/Pasted" frequency beat "Moved" line frequency among the 211 million changed lines we've analyzed over the past five years.



One of the great things about languages with modern IDE support is that, thanks to refactoring tools, legacy code is a thing of the past! Unlike older with languages, developers never have to experience long methods, rambling classes, poor identifier names, complex logic, etc.





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

In modern English, "debt" refers to money you owe. In the Middle Ages, the word had a broader and more moral meaning. Coming from the Old French dette and Latin debitum, it described an obligation or duty — whether financial, moral, or spiritual. It wasn't just about owing money but about fulfilling one's responsibilities.

Although we know that by definition no metaphor is perfect, there are two common ways in which the metaphor is misapplied: assuming technical debt is necessarily something bad; equating technical debt with a financial debt value.
